Volunteers continue to be at the heart of our charity and we have been fortunate to see our volunteer numbers continue to arow over the past year, bucking the trend of many other charities. YOUR STORY

October not only sees Hospice Care Week but also the anniversary of the first patient being admitted to Florence Nightingale Hospice. Over the years, thousands of patients and families have been supported by the Hospice team as our services have grown and extended, thanks to the generosity of our supporters.

Elaine's Nan, Maggie, was one of the first patients at the Hospice, and was very proud to present the flowers to the Duchess of Kent at its official opening on 16th October 1989. She was a regular visitor for respite care through her illness – and was happy to visit the Hospice to take some of the care burden away from the family and to receive the clinical care she needed.

"She was a beautiful soul who never wanted anyone to have to help her. She was aware that her symptoms were distressing for others to witness, and I think that's why she was always willing and happy to attend. I clearly remember the kindness and support that the newly-opened Hospice gave her."

Earlier this year Elaine's family needed to call on the support of the Hospice team again, when her mum, Rose's, cancer progressed. Elaine, her Dad, Tony, and her sisters Sandie and Kim, were caring for Rose at home by themselves until the GP suggested that they could benefit from some additional help and support from the FNH@Home team, a service launched in 2019 to care for patients in their final days and weeks at home.

"Mum and Dad had lived in the same house since 1968, where they had raised me, Sandie and Kim. It was Mum's wish to remain in the house during her illness and to finally die there. She loved her home, and the wonderful memories it held comforted her in her end. From her initial diagnosis she was adamant that she did not want to die in hospital.

"Hearing that outside help was needed made my dad sad and he felt that he'd let her down because in his words 'it was my responsibility to care for her'." But when the FNH@Home team visits started, we could see that Mum was feeling relieved. The specialised bed and equipment that was supplied was perfect for her needs and Dad was also able to relax a little and at 85 years old he really needed it. Every day we were all comforted knowing that the FNH carers were always either on their way or had been and were coming back later on in the day.



"At times when Mum's pain caused her to become agitated, the nurses were just a phone call away and they would come immediately to ensure she was settled. This level of support made a huge difference to us all as our anxiety levels were reduced a little by knowing they were always there. She was finally comfortable, relatively pain free and she had everything and everyone around her to ensure her death was as dignified, and as comfortable as possible. She was 89 years young when she passed away, her mind was still as sharp as a pin and she knew that she was at home with her life's belongings surrounding her."

Remembering loved ones with Forever Flowers

A display of 1,000 stunning, hand-crafted metal forget-me-nots set in the beautiful grounds of the Aviary Gardens at Waddesdon Manor in April formed our second Forever Flowers installation. not to their mum, she said "I will never forget the colours and the sounds of the birdsong. Being able to touch mum's name on the dedication board was an emotional moment, it is a memory that I will treasure for ever."

Each of the Forever Forget-Me-Nots was dedicated to the memory of a loved one. It was a really special project for us at the charity and we were thrilled to see the end result, with many visitors commenting on the contrast of the striking blue flowers against the yellow daffodils and green lawns.



Graham had Motor Neurone Disease and was admitted to the Hospice in July 2022 after a chest infection, to review his medication.

The family hadn't recognised how advanced his illness had become, however with the support, compassion, and care of the staff at the Hospice, they were able to start preparing for end-of-life care. Graham stayed at the Hospice for three weeks and found the garden a beautiful place to sit with his family and visitors.

"The Hospice Garden became a place to breathe, reflect, cry, to sit together and eat lunch and to share precious time with Graham, it brought us peace and tranquillity during a very difficult and sad time in our lives."



Whilst Debbie spent up to 12 hours a day beside Graham, she was supported by Tracey, Ward Sister and created a mosaic of a cornflower. Cornflowers symbolise love, tenderness, unity, and remembrance which felt particularly poignant to Debbie.

"Tracey was fantastic at helping me to engage in a creative activity whilst sitting with Graham. She provided me with the outline, board and mosaic tiles in then right colours and I sat quietly creating the mosaic, watching Graham while he slept in the chair.

It was an emotional time and I love the final result, I got a photo tile printed of it and that is now on my bedroom wall with a picture of us both in happier times."

"Everyone who cared for Graham and supported us was so respectful, kind and compassionate. The Hospice is a sanctuary of kindness, and I can't thank the staff and volunteers enough for the care they showed us."

As Graham moved in to end-of-life care, it was agreed that he would be cared for at home, supported by the FNH@Home Team and Sue, Palliative Care Specialist Physiotherapist. Debbie told us "Graham wanted to pass away at home with me and his children. The support we received from the whole team was incredible as it gave us the confidence to care for him at home in his final days.

When we came home, we knew that we had limited time together. Graham passed away on 11th December 2022 peacefully in my arms in his home. I am comforted knowing I was able to support his final wishes."

You made a difference

Debbie recently nominated our Palliative Care Specialist Physiotherapist, Sue for a 'You Made a Difference Award' at the Buckinghamshire NHS Trust Awards, and we were delighted when Sue was presented with the award.

"Sue is an exceptional person, with so much care and compassion, going above and beyond to help us cope with the emotions around limited life expectancy.

Sue is supportive, kind and educating. She quickly became someone that we relied upon to give us support and clear information about Graham's condition. Sue's impact on Graham's MND journey and the way she helped us made such a difference, her support gave us the confidence to fulfil Graham's wish to be cared for at home in his dying days, supporting me emotionally when things got really tough and being here when Graham finally fell asleep forever.

It was a true honour to be asked to present the award to Sue at the awards evening, everyone should have Sue in their life."



CHALLENGE EVENTS

Every year, we are so humbled by those in the community who wish to take on great challenges to fundraise for us, and this year has been no different! We can't tell you about and thank everyone who has fundraised for us, however, we would like to highlight a couple of our recent fundraisers.

Earlier this summer, **James** took part in the impressive 'Race to the Stones' event which is an incredible 100km ultramarathon from Lewknor, Oxfordshire to Avebury, Wiltshire.

James' Grandfather was treated in a Hospice and this, combined with James training to be one of our volunteer bereavement listeners, was his motivation to raise money for the charity.

Having previously run the event over two days, he wanted to make it more challenging by going the full distance over one day and using the sleepover point as just a quick pit stop.

James completed the run in an amazing time of 12 hours, 48 minutes and raised over £900 for the charity. Well done James on your extraordinary efforts!

Mia recently completed a seven-mile ride across the Cotswolds with her beloved pony, Lizzie and raised a fantastic £524 for us.

Mia wanted to fundraise for the charity as she, and her brother, were able to visit their nan in



"I cannot think how I would have coped without the Hospice"

Our amazing supporter Kate shares why she supports us with a monthly gift.

"My husband, Paul Heslop was 76 when he died in the Hospice in December 2020. We had both been married before and were together for 15 wonderful years. Paul had first been diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2008; at the end of 2020 following a string of procedures, he deteriorated and came to the Hospice for end of life care. 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The benefits of having a Will

Thinking about your death and what would happen to your estate is something most of us avoid. But there is a great deal of benefit in making a Will.

A Will is a document that specifies how your estate is distributed on your death. If you die without a Will, then your estate will be distributed in accordance with the intestacy provisions. Broadly speaking the intestacy provisions follow your closest blood relatives, but that may not necessarily be what you want.

Even with a simple Will that does benefit your

closest relatives, you have the opportunity to name executors (the people responsible for administering your estate) and guardians of any minor children. You can also leave legacies to individuals and / or charities. Having a Will can also make your estate much easier to administer.

Whilst we will always try and make a Will which accommodates changes to your family structure, we advise that you review your Will every 5-8 years, and especially when your circumstances change. A Will is revoked on marriage and a divorce can alter how a Will is interpreted. Any Will review should include a consideration of your assets and how you hold them, especially if any assets are jointly owned. It should also take into account the latest tax advice.
