Every year you help us care for over 1,300 patients and their families, giving them the specialist and individual care they need, both in the Hospice and in their own homes. Your donations, fundraising, retail purchases and sponsorship have helped fund £1.3million of hospice care across Buckinghamshire and its borders over the last year.

We hope to do more trips in the future as it's so important for patients to have safe, worry-free experiences outside the home and hospital."

Choose How You Want to be Remembered

The next Dying Matters Awareness Week takes place from 6th – 12th May. The theme focuses on the language that we use around death, dying and grief.



It is so important that we feel comfortable to talk about death, how and where we want to die and how our lives are celebrated with loved ones as shown by Fiona's story. Fiona was cared for by our FNH@Home team last summer.

Fiona's husband, Neale, told us "With encouragement, Fiona had spoken about her wishes for her funeral. She wanted a service with a celebrant, a big party afterwards and she didn't want people to wear black. Fiona chose the music she wanted to be played and she loved flowers and wanted lots at her funeral, and afterwards she wanted these to be taken to the patients at Florence Nightingale Hospice. Everyone was in big bold colours which summed Fiona up," Neale said, adding "She got the funeral she wanted".

Welcome Hannah

Hannah joined in September, working as a Lymphoedema Practitioner. Based in the Lymphoedema Clinic, she meets patients to discuss individual treatment plans to help them understand and effectively manage their symptoms.

Treatments for Lymphoedema include skin care, exercises, compression therapy, kinesio taping and Manual Lymphatic Drainage.

The Lymphoedema Team run daily clinics at the Hospice and also spend time in the community supporting patients. Hannah's role, along with her team members, is funded by the Charity.


Hannah told us "I enjoy seeing the difference that treatment makes to our patients. With time, support and treatment they can see an improvement and their quality of life is greatly improved. It really is such a rewarding job."

Welcome Maria

Maria joined in October as a Rehabilitation Assistant. Maria told us "My main role is to support the Therapy staff to provide high quality holistic person-centred care to palliative care patients to maximise their quality of life and sense of wellbeing.

"This is both within the Inpatient Unit at the Hospice and visiting patients in their own homes. I am also a point of contact for relatives and carers, ensuring continuity of care within the Therapy team and wider Hospice teams.

"I enjoy helping to enable and encourage patients to do the things that they want to do within their own limitations."

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Fiona & Neale

"I don't know how they did it"

shared Neal when he discussed the FNH@Home team's care for his wife, Fiona.

Fiona, aged 66, died on 10th June, 2023 at her home in Hillesden, Buckinghamshire. Diagnosed with breast cancer in 2018, Fiona began her treatment at Milton Keynes Hospital before transitioning to home care and the FNH@Home team.

Neale, Fiona's partner of 35 years, expressed gratitude for the team's dedication to providing personal care, offering choices, and spending unhurried time with Fiona. "I was in awe. I hadn't even known that care at home existed. It gave us an element of choice. It was a sad time, but there was also a lot of laughter."

Throughout Fiona's illness, the Hospice team provided essential equipment, including a hospital



bed and wheelchair. Fiona was a lover of flowers and a keen gardener, Neale now has cherished memories of tending to Fiona's garden as per her precise instructions.

After Fiona died, Neale used the bereavement listening service offered by the Charity. Regular conversations were a valuable outlet to express his thoughts and feelings. He recently stopped using the service and is now thinking about becoming a volunteer bereavement listener but not quite yet. Neale said that Fiona wanted him to talk about the care she received from the Hospice.

Maggie & Jen



"The nurses dealt beautifully with any problems" said Jen, "Mum trusted them and felt she was in safe hands."

Maggie was diagnosed with stage 4 endometrial cancer in September 2021. She received chemotherapy and was able to attend her granddaughter's wedding in the summer of 2022. However, the chemo was damaging to her heart and early in 2023 she decided to stop.

"The nurses were fabulous"

Jen considers that she was very lucky as she was with her mum when the FNH@Home visited for the first time as it made her realise that care at home was possible with the support of the Hospice team. The Hospice provided a slide sheet to help manoeuvre her, a commode, catheter equipment and a hospital bed.

Jen stayed with Maggie for her last days and the Florence Nightingale Hospice nurses visited Maggie twice a day to wash her and make her feel comfortable. They advised Jen and her Dad how to support Maggie between their visits. Jen said the nurses took time to answer questions and offered plenty of support in distressing moments.

"The nurses were fabulous," Jen said, "they were all lovely in different ways. They were very gentle, Maggie centred and remembered the things that mattered to my Mum."

Retail Anniversaries

30 Years in Retail

Last year we celebrated 30 years in retail as our first shop opened in Aylesbury in 1993. In the run-up to our 30th birthday, our shops created special window displays, sold limited-edition badges and bags featuring a commemorative retail logo and we produced 30 pieces of social media content all about our shops.

We talked about this milestone with our Head of Retail, Lily Caswell who shared

"We loved celebrating the 30th anniversary of Retail at FNHC! It's a fantastic milestone to reach and great testament to how well the Charity is supported in the local community. By shopping, donating or volunteering, an incredible amount of people have helped us to grow our retail offer over the past three

decades and raise vital funds to provide hospice care to thousands of people across Buckinghamshire and its borders.

"The estimated turnover for our shops over the past 30 years is over $\pounds17$ million, with 100% of the profits going to the Hospice. We currently have 13 shops and an online sales team with plans to get to 20 shops in the next three years. Our shops are there to provide sustainable profit to help fund vital local hospice care, and we look forward to being able to do this for decades to come."



Shop Milestones

Our Marlow, Beaconsfield and Hazlemere shops have all recently celebrated their one-year anniversaries and are some of the newest shops added to our family. Celebrating Sustainable Fashion Week

For the second year in a row, we participated in the Charity Retail Association's 'Sustainable Fashion Week'. From 25th September to 8th October, we encouraged our local community to shop sustainably by choosing to buy second hand items from one of our 13 shops. Over the last year, our shops have kept over 733 tonnes of textiles out of landfill through reselling and recycling and we intend to see that number grow and grow.

We also worked with schools across Buckinghamshire on our 'Sustainable Fashion in Schools' initiative. Our Retail and Marketing teams have developed a package of educational materials to support assemblies, workshops and classroom activities to inform young people about the fashion industry and the role of charity shops in sustainability. We have loved seeing the energy and knowledge that students and staff have on the subject, with many already being proud charity shop shoppers and donors.



Angels Den

The Clare Foundation hosted a wonderful fundraising evening called 'Angels Den'. It was a charity event not dissimilar to BBC's 'Dragons Den', held at beautiful Missenden Abbey and attended by an array of fabulous local charities. Ten charities were invited, and all had to pitch for Clare Foundation funding.

Head of Retail, Lily Caswell and Head of Fundraising, Lee Lloyd gave a very heart-felt presentation that impressed the judges and audience as they described the role of retail income in providing hospice care for local people.

We're thrilled that we were awarded £7,000, which will move us closer to achieving our goal of purchasing a new electric van to support our Retail operation.

Lily Caswell said "We were honoured to be one of the ten charities to be given the opportunity to take part in the first ever Angels Den event. It was a fantastic evening, and it was great learning more about other local charities from a range of different sectors. We are so grateful for the donation which the Clare Foundation granted us, which will help us towards our goal of purchasing an electric van to support our Retail department in an energy efficient way. We may have to resort to snuggling up with camels which are accompanying us on the trek to keep warm – it won't be any worse than sleeping next to my snoring husband though!"

At the time of writing, the group have raised an incredible £9,589!

"Colourful clothes, no drab black"

wrote Fiona Paine to her family in November 2021.

Fiona's husband Ed said that Fiona gave him plenty of instructions about her funeral plans: "I've decided I am OK with being cremated and that you should have a big party to celebrate how much I love you all."

Fiona died from Lymphoma on 3rd August 2023, a couple of weeks after her daughter's wedding; she was 62. Fiona was able to attend the wedding at the church near her house. It was the last time she got out of bed.

Fiona was cared for in the last three weeks of her life by the Florence Nightingale nurses who form the FNH@Home team. This team cares for patients at the end of their lives in their own homes across Buckinghamshire and its borders.

"She loved it when they walked through the door," Ed said, as they immediately put her at ease. "She loved her home, looking out over the garden she

had created, and the care she received from the Florence Nightingale Team was priceless."

The team came twice a day and then three times, to look after Fiona, wash her and make her comfortable as she soon became bed bound. Over the three weeks her ability to talk tailed off but she could still smile, and they carried on talking to her and making her smile, "they took a great load off of us" Ed said.

Ed is fundraising for FNH@Home as he plays trumpet in the Aylesbury Vale Concert Orchestra which regularly donates all proceeds from its concerts to FNH@Home.
